Helen Hunt Jackson—Featured Author

The first woman author in California to be honored with a Literary Landmark. Helen Hunt Jackson was an American poet, novelist, and passionate activist on behalf of the Native American Indian. She came to California and found examples of unfair treatment and abuses of several American Indian Tribes. Following the example of her friend, Harriet Beecher Stowe, who wrote the novel "Uncle Tom's Cabin", to gain support for American negroes, Helen believed that a powerful novel could win the hearts and minds of the American people. Helen published "Ramona" in 1884 and it became a bestseller that has never gone out of print. The Ramona Pageant was created in 1923 in Hemet, CA and is California's State Outdoor Play. This is the setting for the Literary Landmark to commemorate this outstanding book and author. There is a second plaque located at the Hemet Public Library. The Literary Landmark program of the American Library Association ties together a great writer with a specific location in that writer's life and work to give recognition to an outstanding author. Helen Hunt Jackson is the first in California, we know she will not be the last.
